Child Restraint Offender's Program (C.R.O.P.) FAQs- English

Who can participate in the Child Restraint Offender's Program (C.R.O.P.)?

Drivers who received a "Child Restraint" citation (for non-use or improper use of a car seat) for the first time.

What are the benefits in attending the program?

In addition to learning about how car seats and boosters save lives, Florida laws and other traffic related information, drivers will avoid having 3 points added to their license.

Where is the Child Restraint Offenders Program held?

The course is held at Nicklaus Children's Hospital's main campus, located at 3100 SW 62nd Avenue. Upon entering the hospital, please find the Auditorium.

How often is the course available?

The course is available once a month in English and once a month in Spanish. You can find upcoming dates by calling upon calling **305-663-6865**.

Do I have to attend all the classes listed?

No, please select only one class, in the language of your preference.

How many times can I attend the course?

You are eligible for the course once in a lifetime.

If I select to attend the course, do I still have to pay the citation?

Yes, you must still pay the court and notify them of your intent to participate in C.R.O.P. Please follow instructions on the citation paperwork.

At what time is the course?

You must register for the class, on the class date between 6:00pm-7:00pm. The class is from 7-9pm.

Can minors attend the class?

Children are not permitted in the class.

What do I have to take to the class?

You must bring:

Identification

Citation or case number

\$30.00 in cash (exact change only) or money order for the class fee.

Child's car seat. If the child in the car was not your child, you are not required to bring a car seat to the class.

Are cell phones allowed in class?

While cell phones are allowed, their use is not permitted during class.
